# EVENTS AND HIGHLIGHTS

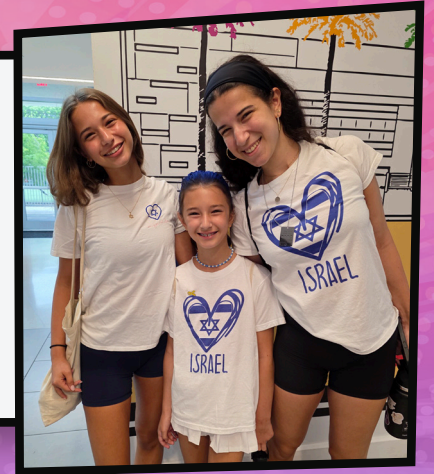
## **FIELD TRIPS**

Each day is a new adventure at Camp Klurman. Our campers (1st-8th grade) travel to a wide assortment of local attractions. These field trips expose campers to many new exciting possibilities, while providing stimulating, challenging and fun opportunities to grow as individuals and within a group. Field trips include museums, aquariums/zoos, water parks, game centers, movies, bowling, and more.



## **JUDAIC & ISRAELI PROGRAMMING**

Judaic programs are an integral part of camp. Campers will have activities with a Judaic specialist and Israeli cultural specialists - Chavaya, Jewish 101, Sababa. Jewish values guide each weekly theme, as well as various activities at camp including, Boker Tov - morning dances and games, weekly Shabbat celebrations, Israel day and more. Our yearly Shinshinim, Israeli Emmissaries, become a part of our summer, teaching campers about Israel and their society.



## **AQUATICS WITH SWIM GYM**



Water safety is always our first priority. Experienced aquatics staff who have WSI and Lifeguard certifications help campers (2yrs - 8th grade) develop swimming skills in a friendly environment. Swim Gym follows the internationally recognized American Red Cross Learn-to-Swim Program. Swim instruction and water play includes: instruction through water play, swim techniques, progress reports, water safety, water polo, climbing wall and relay races in the MBJCC swimming pool, as well as kayaking, canoeing and stand up paddle on the Indian Creek Waterway (1st - 8th grade).

## AI STORYBOOK STUDIO

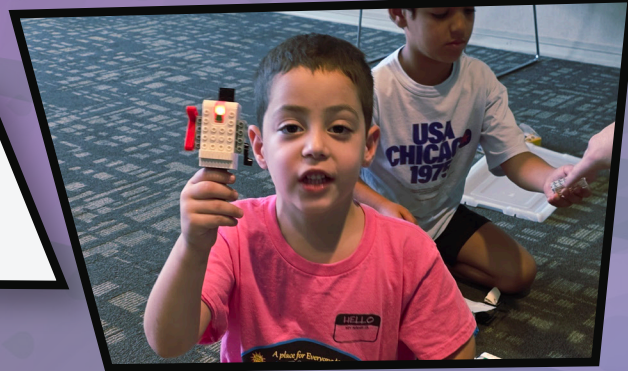
**READING, INTERPRETATION & DIGITAL STORYTELLING**

Entering 1st - 5th grade

June 15 - 19

Campers explore storytelling through reading, discussion, and interpretation of age-appropriate digital stories. Students examine characters, plot, and structure, then use modern digital tools and guided AI support to create illustrated storybooks of their own. Emphasis is placed on reading comprehension, creative decision-making, and expressing ideas clearly.

**TAKE-HOME:** A completed digital storybook



## AI GAME SYSTEMS STUDIO

**DESIGN & INTERACTIVE PLAY**

Entering 1st - 6th grade

June 22 - 26

Campers design and build interactive video games while learning how games respond to player actions. Students explore basic coding logic, rules, and cause-and-effect as they test and improve their creations. By the end of the week, each camper will publish a playable game.

**TAKE-HOME:** A playable, shareable game

## AI APP ENGINEERING & PRODUCT DESIGN

Entering 2nd - 8th

June 29 - July 3

Students design and build simple apps while learning how real digital products are planned and improved. Campers focus on layout, functionality, and user experience using guided tools and feedback. Parents will receive a working version of the app to test.

**TAKE-HOME:** A working app and digital project portfolio

## LEGO SCIENCE LAB

**-FORCES, MOTION & INVESTIGATION**

Entering Kindergarten - 2nd grade

July 6 - 10

Campers explore real science concepts using LEGO as an investigative tool. Students make predictions, test ideas, measure outcomes, and explain results while learning about forces, motion, balance, and energy. This is a science-first experience focused on observation and reasoning.

**TAKE-HOME:** Scientific thinking and hands-on investigative skills

## **LEGO ENGINEERING & MECHANICAL DESIGN**

### **SYSTEMS IN MOTION**

Entering Kindergarten - 2nd grade  
July 13 - 17

Campers design and build LEGO machines that lift, move, and transfer objects. Students learn how gears, levers, and structures work together while solving practical engineering challenges. Emphasis is placed on planning, testing, and improving designs.

**TAKE-HOME:** Engineering strategies and mechanical design experience

## **LEGO ROBOTICS & CODING**

### **AUTOMATION IN ACTION**

Entering Kindergarten - 2nd grade  
July 20 - 24

Campers build and program LEGO robots that respond to their environment using sensors and visual coding. Students learn how instructions and logic control behavior as robots navigate spaces and complete challenges.

## **FASHION DESIGN, BRANDING & DIGITAL CRAFT**

Entering 2nd - 8th grade  
July 27 - 31

Campers design custom wearable items while learning about visual design, color, layout, and branding. Students turn their ideas to life as finished t-shirts or hoodies, focusing on creativity and personal expression.

**TAKE-HOME:** A custom wearable design

## **AI-DRIVEN 3D MODELING & RAPID PROTOTYPING**

Entering 2nd - 8th grade  
August 3 - 7

Campers design objects using AI-assisted 3D modeling tools and produce physical prints. Students learn how ideas move from digital design to real-world objects through planning, testing, and refinement.

**TAKE-HOME:** Custom 3D-printed objects



## **AI CODING WITH MINECRAFT EDUCATION**

Entering 1st - 6th grade  
August 10 - 14

Using Minecraft Education, campers learn how code controls behavior in a digital world. Students use block-based coding and are introduced to JavaScript and Python concepts to create rules, triggers, and automated systems they can see in action.

**TAKE-HOME:** Coded Minecraft worlds and automation projects

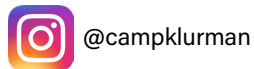
